STAC HITS NEW HIGH

The popularity of our annual Sectional Tournament at Clubs continues to increase. This year the total table count rose to 486 up from last year's 464.

Complete results can be found in this issue on pages 4 - 8 as well as a general breakdown of participation by geographical area.

Next year we may even hit the lofty 500 table mark, a phenomenal feat considering our relatively small baidge playing population.

FUN NIGHT SUCCESS IN BATHURST

Judy Losier reports that the Bathurst Duplicate Bridge Club held it's first "Fun Night" on February 21.

The idea for the game arose from the popularity of the annual Rookie-Master game. The Rookie-Master games have had a good turnout but the rookies never come back until the next year. A regularly scheduled game was needed to keep the newcomers coming back and eventually getting them to the regular games.

Fun Night is a stratified game with stratas of 0 - 5, 5 - 20 and 20 - 50. There is no upper limit on the masterpoint holding of the experienced player but the experienced player must play with a player from one of these three stratas. Inexperienced players may play with each other or with an experienced player.

Each pair is placed in the strata of the player with the lowest masterpoint holding.

The name Fun Night was chosen in keeping with the spirit of having a good time in a relaxed atmosphere.

Of the forty-four participants, there were at least eighteen players with less than five points including a few who had never seen a duplicate board let alone bid boxes.

Only simple standard bids such as regular no trump openings, Stayman, transfers, negative doubles, Blackwood, and Gerber were allowed. Bid boxes were optional. Players were asked to explain any bid that may not be understood and to avoid director calls that would not give the benefit of the doubt to the newcomers.

Inexpensive items were awarded as door prizes and to Strata winners in each direction as well as a lunch in the tradition of North Shore hospitality.

Between lunch, bidding boxes and a totally inexperienced bumping pair, the last round was cancelled so the security guards could close up at midnight.

It was a great evening for all with lots of laughter and almost everyone waiting for the results and prize awards.

At this time, the club is planning to hold a Fun Night once a month and are considering twice a month.

For those of you who want to try this idea, the computer objects to placing experienced players in Stratas below 50 master points. In your game setup select no masterpoints. The masterpoint option can then be enabled through the F9 set option.

Congratulations to Judy Losier and the innovators of Bathurst. What Judy didn't mention were the hours on the telephone which are necessary to make players feel wanted and welcome and the consolidated effort of all experienced club players to make newcomers feel comfortable and welcome at the table. The Laws of Duplicate Bridge will be revised effective May 27, 1997. Many of the changes are cosmetic such as minor wording changes to make the Laws clearer but some of the changes will have a more significant impact for our directors.

Face down opening leads will be mandatory in all ACBL events. As I become familiar with these changes and receive additional information, the changes will be published in future issues of The Maritime Bridge Line.

WIN, PLACE, AND SHOW

Frank, Sam and Tom are in a ten mile race. Frank beats Sam by two miles and he beats Tom by four miles.

If the runners maintain constant speeds throughout the race, by how many miles does Sam beat Tom?

TRIP TO THE BEACH

Jim drives 150 miles to the seashore and it takes him 3 hours and 20 minutes to get there. After an enjoyable day, he returns from the shore to his home in 4 hours and 10 minutes.

By how much (in mph) does the average rate for the trip to the shore exceed the average rate of the entire trip?

TAPERING OFF

Two candles of the same height are lighted at the same time. The first candle completely burns down in four hours while the second burns down in three hours.

Assuming that each candle burns at a constant rate, how many hours after being lighted was the first candle twice the height of the second candle?

Solution to last May's problems:

On The High Seas

After the two hour chase, at 1:45 PM the distance between the two ships is 4 miles. Let t be the number of hours needed for the privateer to overtake the merchantman. Let D and D + 4 be the distances covered in t hours by the merchantman and the privateer, respectively.

Then Rate of merchantman x t = D, and Rate of privateer x t = D + 4 or $[(8 \times 17)/15] t = D + 4$ and 8t = D; therefore $\{[(8 \times 17)/15] - 8\} t = 4$ and t = 3.75 hours so the ships meet at 5:30.

Track Stars

Let x = Bob's time in seconds. Letting L represent the length of the track, we have (L/40)(15) + (L/x)(15) = 1 and x (Bob's time) = 24 seconds. The Shakes

Let n be the number of people present. Single out a particular individual P. P shakes hands with (n-1) persons, and this is true for each of the n persons. Since each handshake is between two persons, the total number of handshakes is n(n-1)/2 = 28. Therefore n = 28. Marching Along
