BENNETT AND BETTS WIN CANADIAN OPEN PAIRS

MARITIMERS WIN COPC

Two of the Maritimes' top players combined to win Canada's most prestigious Pairs Championship.

The COPC Final was held in conjunction with the CNTC National Finals in Surrey, British Columbia, June 9 - 14.

Randy Bennett from St. John's, Newfoundland and Mike Betts from Fall River, Nova Scotia are the 1997 Canadian Open Pairs Champions. They topped an all-star field in the two session final with a score of 417.8, over a board above second place winners, Felipe Hernandez and Michael Neagu, of Coquitlam, BC.

Randy and Mike are not a new partnership. They played on the winning CNTC team in 1990. That year they played on a team from Ottawa which included Doug Heron, Ed Zaluski, David Willis and John Valliant.

This is the first time that a Maritime pair has won a Canadian Open Pairs Championship and it speaks volumes about the bridge ability of these two fine players.

Besides their superior bridge ability, Randy and Mike are a compatible pair who get along well together and who are a pleasure to play against. You won't find them criticizing each other or unhappy with each other at the table, something that unfortunately plagues many pairs.




