NEWCOMERS TO PLAY IN VALLEY SECTIONAL

The executive of Unit 194 spent a good portion of their meeting in Bridgewater discussing ways to introduce new players to the game of duplicate bridge.

After considerable discussion, it was decided that a special game be held during the Annapolis Valley Sectional.

This newcomers game would be open to new players who had very few master points or who had never played duplicate before.

The game will be one session and will run concurrently with the first round of the Open Pairs at 1:30 pm on Saturday, September 25.

The newcomers will play the same hands as the open but not as many.

The field will be stratified into three stratas. A = 20-50 points, B = 5 - 20 points and c = 0 - 5 points. Trophies will be awarded to the winners of each strata.

Following the session of bridge there will be a reception for the newcomers. They will have wine and cheese, receive a souvenir of the game and have an opportunity to discuss the results of the hands they have played with the more experienced members of the executive.

We are asking clubs to promote this special game among their newer players. Efforts to get newcomer games in the past usually failed because there were not enough players to have a separate game. This meant that the pairs who did turn out either had to go home or play in the regular game, neither of which is a palatable option to the newcomer.

The Unit is keenly interested is finding ways to introduce new players to the game. If you have

suggestions we would be happy to hear them.

We know just how enjoyable and gratifying the game of bridge can be. We have to find a way of exposing new people to this terrific pastime.

This year the Annapolis Valley Sectional will be held at the Wandlyn Inn in Coldbrook, NS.

To get to the venue, take Highway 101 to the Valley and take exit 14.

The Wandlyn Inn is clearly visible to the right of the exit ramp.
