

JE ME SOUVIENS

I had the distinct pleasure of travelling to the Quebec City Regional last October with Bernie Britten, Jo Ann Lynds and Boyd Wells to compete in the District Finals of the Flight B Grand National Teams. As this would be the last year that we would be eligible to play Flight B (under 1500) we had decided in the Spring to compete. We played in the Open Pairs and the Bracketed Knock- Out to practice as the Flight B Teams was on the last day. Here are a couple of hands from the KO.

Even with a diamond lead, Jo Ann pitched her losing diamond on a heart and knocked out the trump Ace. + 1370.

At our table, I led the diamond 5 against 3NT and declarer (thinking there was no point in holding up) won the first trick with the ace. He went after clubs. Imagine my surprise when partner now took five diamond tricks. + 200.

Notice that after the diamond lead, declarer has only eight tricks in NT even if the J10 of spades fall in 3 rounds. Moral of the story: RAISE PARTNER even if you think you play better!
