BRIDGE WEEK AND CAN-AT SUCCESSES

Congratulations of all Maritime bridge players are certainly in order to Leo Weniger, Zone 1 Director of the Canadian Bridge Federation and to Kathie MacNab, Can-At 2000 chair and their committees for the tremendous success of the Festival of Bridge.

The Festival of Bridge was held in Halifax the last two weeks of June and consisted of Bridge Week (the Canadian Bridge Championships) held at the newly renovated Lord Nelson Hotel and Can-At 2000 which was held at the World Trade and Convention Center.

Both events were tremendous successes due in large part to the efforts of many volunteers and committee members (too numerous to name) whose meticulous efforts led to a picture perfect two weeks of competitive bridge.

Bridge Week consisted of the CNTC (Open Team Championship, the CWTC (Womens Team Championship and the COPC (Open Pairs Championship). We are particularly proud of the showing of our teams in the CNTC and CWTC. (See articles on page 2 and 7).

The popularity and reputation of the Maritimes as a venue for Canadian Championships is brought home by the fact that no less than 27 of 28 teams that qualified for the CNTC Finals came all the way to Nova Scotia to compete.

And they weren't disappointed. The hospitality, friendly competition and attention to detail by the committee led to an enjoyable bridge experience for all of the competitors regardless of their bridge results.

With only the COPC overlapping the Can-At

schedule, many of the bridge week competitors stayed to do some sight-seeing and to play in some of the Can-At events.

The impressive WTTC provided a wonderful venue for CAN-AT 2000 and the tournament ended with more than 750 tables in attendance. Once again the work of the committee (many of whom also worked on Bridge Week) was evidenced by the smiling faces and positive comments of the players.

A player survey of one of the busiest sessions showed that approximately 70% of the players were from outside Nova Scotia. This was due in part to internet contacts, the presence of the wonderful Audrey Grant and the spreading of the word by some of our greatest fans like Jerry Helms, professional bridge teacher and player who encourages his many students and partners to come to the Maritimes and play in one of North America's friendliest tournaments.

Congratulations to the many who made this undertaking a success. All things are possible when the vision is supported by dedication and hard work. We are proud of you all!

MIRAMICHI A WINNER

It comes as no surprise that the Miramichi Split Regional was a great success. Congratulations to June Hare and her committee for a tremendous example of Maritime hospitality.

A total of 562 tables turned out to enjoy the best of Maritime Bridge and hospitality. Any player that happened to be watching their waistline was in for a shock as the committee continued to outdo itself every night after the game. Everyone left the Miramichi with a smile on their faces. A great job, folks.

CNTC 2001 CHANGES

The conditions of contest for CNTC 2001 have changed dramatically. There are no changes in the Canadian Womens Team Championship (CWTC).

The Canadian National Team Champioships (CNTC) still require club qualification. Club qualifying rounds may be held up to January 15, 2001. There will be NO Unit Final. Teams will qualify directly to the Zone Final which will be held in Moncton, March 31, April 1, 2001.

Each zone will qualify two (2) teams to the National Final (one subsidized). Prior to the National Final there will be a two and a half day round robin (open to any eligible team) that will qualify 5 teams for the Final Round - Robin. In addition, the 2000 winners automatically qualify for a total of eighteen teams.

There will also be a Flight B competition for players with less than 1000 master points.

The main topic of discussion will be initiating a 'novice standard of bidding'.

At 2:00 a duplicate style game will be held to accommodate the mornings lesson and hand records will be distributed after the game. All bridge instructors are asked to participate as consultants during the game.

There is a \$20.00 fee for the workshop and the game which are open to all players up to the rank of life master. All Maritime bridge instructors are encouraged to attend the student workshop at no cost and attend the dinner session for the 'Teachers Information Exchange '.
