# THIRTY YEARS IN PRINT

### Maritime Bridge Line Celebrates Thirtieth

The first issue of the Maritime Bridge Line went to press in 1972. The editor was Glynford Hatfield (top bridge player and regular partner of the late George Caldwell).

Glyn got away from the game and the Bridge Line and his successor was Richard Brown, of Dartmouth. Richard and his wife, Sharron Lewis, formed one of the top mixed pairs in the Maritimes.

The third editor of the Bridge Line was Gary Brown. Gary was also a top bridge player who held the position of editor until 1991. He then moved to Australia where he has become a successful bridge teacher and professional player.

During these years the Maritime Bridge Line was printed on glossy paper and was a very impressive magazine. Unfortunately, that format, while attractive, was quite expensive to print and the Units were looking for ways to continue to keep their membership informed and entertained in a more economical manner.

Karl Hicks agreed to be the editor and the trial format was a multiple sheet, mimeographed newsletter which continues to this day.

The publishing costs dropped dramatically using this format and, in fact, are now lower than they have ever been .

The Maritime Bridge Line was originally mailed to individual Unit members. Again this was time consuming and expensive so a new method of distribution was developed.

The 400 copies for Unit 230 are bussed to Moncton where Ann and Mike Hartop package them and forward them to each club by Busvelope.

The 500 copies for Unit 194 are packaged and mailed to each of the clubs in Nova Scotia and

Newfoundland.

There are approximately twenty members of both units who have the Bridge Line mailed to them three times a year for an annual fee of \$5.00.

#### SOME THOUGHTS ON KNOCKOUT TEAMS

an editorial

The Maritimes have always held knockout team events at their sectionals. (an exception to the North American rule.). Thirty years ago, when tournaments were significantly larger, these events were seeded. That is to say that the team with the most master points played the first round against the team with the least, the second most played next to last, etc. The Swiss movement was restricted to chess tournaments. The Sunday team game was Board-A-Match. The seeded knockout teams and Board-A-Match highly favored the top teams and, as a result, participation in team events began to decline. In fact, tournament attendance itself began to decline. In the seventies, the Swiss Movement was introduced which became an instant success. While the better teams still dominated, lesser teams were still virtually guaranteed a win or two in the later rounds when they played other hapless teams.

Knockout participation continued to decline. The solution was to have a random draw. Now the lowest team seldom had to play the top team. In fact, the best thing that could happen to the field was that the top two teams played each other in round one. Many fingers were crossed during the draw.

Controversy now centered upon the scheduling of the KOs. The first round was held Friday afternoon, the second Friday evening and the third during the midnight game. On occasions when a fourth session was required, it was impossible to schedule. Various solutions were attempted but there just wasn't enough time unless the KOs overlapped with another event which was not popular among the top players who were vying for the various master point trophies. Some players wouldn't play if the third round was during the Midnight game and others wouldn't play if they had to play Saturday afternoon or even Saturday morning. And so now our Knockouts are running from 4 - 8 tables and we even had a tournament recently where there was no Knockout Teams for the first time in history.

I personally feel that the Knockout Teams is the premiere event at a tournament. It allows you to play real bridge (you don't have to worry about overtricks, playing in a major as opposed to a minor, or worrying whether to play in 3NT rather than four of a major). Plus the KOs give the greatest master point awards of all ACBL events.

I would propose that we have a Compact Knockout teams in lieu of our current KO. This is how it works.

All matches are 12 boards. This would accommodate up to 16 teams and be completed Friday evening. The winners of the first match would play round two while the losers automatically play in the first round of the consolation. Losers of round two and the first round of the consolation now can play in the Friday evening Pairs game.

Winners of round two and the first consolation round play Friday evening. The losers, unfortunately, are finished at 9:30 at which time the finals take place.

This is a legitimate ACBL event with very good master point awards. Teams are restricted to four(4) players and matches are random draw. The advantages:

- 1. No worry about a third session.
- 2. Teams losing their second match are not eliminated from the Friday evening pairs.
- 3. Shorter matches give ordinary teams a chance even if they draw a top team.

#### Success At Bridge

A number of years ago, I was about to play for the first time with a new-to-duplicate-but-keen novice. As the experienced member of the partnership, I thought it appropriate to lay down some rules.

"There are only two rules that MUST be followed to have a successful game of bridge."

This was greeted by a moment of silence. I could hear the thoughts running through my partner's head -- Can I handle these rules? Will I understand them? Imagine, all of bridge boiled down to just two rules! What if I forget? Oh, God!

"The two rules are: 1. Be polite. 2. Have fun. "

This was followed by immense relief on my partner's behalf.

Unfortunately, not everyone "gets" these rules ... Fast forward to a recent game. The following "Teacher-Student" situation occurred:

The Heart Ace was led and 12 tricks quickly claimed. The cards weren't yet put away when Teacher launched into the recriminations.

Teacher (shaking): "Why didn't you bid 6D? It's a great sac!"

Student: "But you said not to bid again after I preempted."

Teacher: "But you know I have long Diamonds! Just bid 6D!!"

Analysis: "Teacher" was guilty of demolishing the two rules listed above. His behavior was disrespectful to his partner, the opponents, and the game of bridge. ... By the way, the Student was right. A preemptor should virtually never bid again, unless forced. Responder is Captain of the auction. A corollary is that when Responder increases the preempt, he first determines the level to which he is willing to go and then bids it. He then leaves the guessing up to the opponents, knowing that they will guess right some of the time.

Final thoughts: At-the-table analysis is sometimes right, but often wrong. Treating your partner and the opponents with courtesy is ALWAYS right.
