### Success At Bridge -- Part 3

The previous article looked at how, when faced with adversity (I believe down 9 in a slam bid on a 2-0 trump fit counts as "adversity"), one of the Maritimes' great players Succeeded at Bridge by following the two rules -- 1. Be polite. 2. Have fun. While most of us can't match the play of that champion, we <u>can</u>, and should, match his/her table manners.

Now let's look at one of New England's great players in a similar circumstance. Since he won't be embarrassed by reading this, I'll identify our hero as Charlie Coon, holder of more than 15,000 MPs and, in my view, Mr. Bridge for New England.

The setting is a mid-1970's Sectional Open Pairs. Charlie and one of his regular partners, Leslie Popper, were facing the father-son duo of Ken & Jon Shute. Partner was Dealer, and I picked up S-A3 H-A5 D-AK109832 C-105 Not Vul against Vul.

Partner Passed and Leslie Popper bid "1 Heart". I won't give you all of my rationale, but, I, like you, am a bridge player (see Rule # 2 above), and this was matchpoints. "3NT", I said (no bidding boxes in those days). It <u>did</u> occur to me that if Partner had as little as 2 small Diamonds, the suit could break 2-2 and I could garner 9 tricks via 7 Diamonds and the major suit Aces.

Charlie thought for a bit and Doubled, resulting in the final contract of 3NT X.

Charlie duly led a Heart, and Dummy tabled an awful hand of just 3 HCP. But the 3 HCP were the QJxx of Diamonds! Making 3NT X, with 4 Hearts and 4 Spades cold the other way.

At the end of the hand, Charlie said, "May I see your hand?"

While he was looking the hand over and thinking his thoughts, I was sweating. It was pretty clear that we were father and son, and that was an unbelievably fortuitous Diamond holding ("embarrassment of riches" comes to mind). I wanted to say, "Charlie, I didn't know!"

I waited for the recriminations and/or Director call. Charlie folded my cards, placed them back in the board, and said, "Nice bid."

It was like the weight of the world had lifted off my shoulders. Did he really think it was a "Nice bid."? Probably not, but what an example of sportsmanship!!

There is an amusing post script to this story. For 20 years I had used Charlie as my role model in dealing with "fixes" by an opponent. Then, I ran into Charlie again at a Regional in New England in 1998. Between sessions I mentioned his outstanding behavior to him and the inspiration it had been to me.

Charlie, temporarily moved by my story, thanked me very sincerely. Then he made a mean, fierce face, and said, "But don't let it happen again!"
