LEO WENIGER ELECTED TO ACBL BOARD

For the first time in ACBL History, a Maritimer is representing District 1 on the Board of Directors of the American Contract Bridge League. The ACBL is divided into 25 geographical Districts. Canada makes up three of these (Districts 1-3). District 1 consists of eastern Ontario, Quebec and the Atlantic provinces.

Mr Weniger won the position by acclamation at the District 1 Annual meeting this past summer. The opening followed the retirement of George Retek, of Montreal, who capably represented the District for thirty-three years. His predecessor, also from Montreal, held the position for over two decades.

Leo has a long history in bridge governance and in volunteering. It started in the late 70's when he took the position of Vice-President of Acadian Unit 230. Then he moved to Halifax, where he really became involved.

He served as Zone 1 Director and Vice-President of the Canadian Bridge Federation. Zone 1 is comprised of the four Atlantic Provinces. He was Co-Chair of the Canadian Bridge Federations Bridge Week as well as the Can-At Regional in 2000. He was also a member of the ACBL Board of Governors for ten years. Leo is an accredited ACBL Teacher and has taught bridge in schools in the Halifax area at the elementary, Junior and Senior High School levels.

He was elected Vice-President of District 1 for two years and then was elected President of District 1 and held that position for over 20 years. Leo attributes his interest in bridge governance to his mentor and friend, George Retek, who has served our District with distinction.

In addition to these impressive credentials, Leo has volunteered for cultural, social and sports events and served on various community boards and charitable organizations and still finds time to play basketball once a week..

Leo is also a fine bridge player being one of only a handful of Maritime players to earn over 5000 master points before the onslaught of the internet. He is more than a patient partner and ever the gentleman, a fact to which I can personally attest.

Congratulations, Leo. We appreciate your efforts on our behalf as well as your tireless devotion to Maritime Bridge. 😊😊😊😊

2012 in Review

Not counting STAC, our first tournament was Halifax in February. LHO (along with me) never dreamed of it, and the slam made. We eked out first, while our table opponents finished a very close third. If LHO finds his partner's void on the lead, we finish third and they win. See what I mean?

In March we played in St. John, where I met the clown on Sunday morning, and played like a clown thereafter. See "Send in the Clowns" in Maritime Bridge Line. We then had to miss the return of the Truro Sectional, as we were at the Gatlinburg, Tennessee Regional at that time.

Gatlinburg! Our first time there. Gilles St. Hilaire found a great condo on VRBO.com for us to share with him and Anne and Leo Mahoney. We had a lot of fun, including one session where Gilles, a pickup partner, Anne and I ran away with a board a match side game as a B team in a field that was half A teams. We also were thrilled to visit the craft area just outside Gatlinburg—wonderful paintings, jewelry, leather, woodworking etc. 117 outlets in an 8 mile stretch. I bought a mountain dulcimer there! (Look it up.) We also did 2 days of sightseeing, including the fantastic Biltmore Estate in Asheville, NC.

At the Newfoundland Sectional, we played in the Team game with Randy Bennett, Stuart Eastwood, and Grant Ardern. How did we do? Hint: if you play in a team game with Randy, it's a two step process—**one**, buy your entry; **two**, immediately go to the prize desk and claim your prize. If you haven't played in the Newfoundland Sectional, do yourself a BIG favor and book it the next time it crops up (summer 2014?). The hospitality and warmth there are on another level. The next weekend my daughter Katie got married in Paradise (look it up)! It was a great wedding, with most of my immediate family visiting St. John's with us. Signal Hill, the Fluvarium (look it up ☺), and the Geo Centre are all worthwhile.

MONCTON CLUB HOSTS SUCESSFUL ROOKIE EVENT

The Moncton Duplicate Bridge Club got off to a roaring start with it's first-ever participation in the annual Erin Berry Rookie-Master game on October 24. A total of eighteen new players gathered in the Lions Community Centre on St. George Boulevard to put their skills to the test - the second largest turnout among the 19 clubs from coast to coast taking part in the annual event.

Although the talented young player in whose memory the nation-wide fundraiser is named spent some of her formative years in Moncton, this marked the first time that the Moncton Club was involved.

A rookie-master event gives people who are just getting started in competitive bridge an opportunity to pair with more experienced players. Moncton President Connie Bartlett is excited both about the numbers and the enthusiasm the new club members are showing.

"Our club has shown strong growth over the past several years, and there's definitely a lot of developing interest in duplicate bridge in the Greater Moncton area", she says, "We've made a conscious effort to make our club as welcoming as possible to new participants, and we're beginning to see the results."

Proceeds from the rookie masters events across Canada are used to assist junior players in attending national and international tournaments. Bartlett noted that 24 young people from Greater Moncton have benefitted from the national fund-raising effort over the past five years, receiving a total of nearly \$14,000.

Erin Berry was born in Cold Lake, Alberta. She also lived in Sydney and Moncton before moving to Saskatchewan. In August of 1997 she became a Life Master at the age of 16, but less than a year later she was killed in a highway accident in Rhode Island.

Karen Wood and Bette Gallander of the Capital City Club in Victoria, BC earned the day's top score with a 74.61% game. Two pairs from the Fundy Duplicate Bridge Club in Saint John - Ed Kaine and Sandy Stevens and Marion Oram and Jim Anderson - were the only Maritimers to finish in the top ten, with scores of 65.43% and 65.17% respectively.
