## A GREAT OPPORTUNITY FOR NEW PLAYERS

### **Moncton Club Hosts 0-299 Tournament in April**

Newcomers now have an opportunity to play in a tournament and not have to compete against Life Masters, experts (real or imagined) or players who've played duplicate for decades and never bothered to join the ACBL. For the first time in Eastern Canada, newcomers can compete against their peers and win prizes and silver points.

No player with 300 or more master points can compete in this tournament. This is an excellent opportunity for new, inexperienced players to compete with their peers in a comfortable, relaxed atmosphere.

The tournament was spearheaded by Mark Golding, Jenny Huntsman and Connie Bartlett from the Moncton area. Mark is the tournament Chairman and Connie is looking after partnerships. (See the full page Flyer later in this issue).

Jenny and Connie are two enthusiastic new players who felt that we should offer a tournament for new players to introduce them to tournament play among their peers. This is the first tournament of its kind in Eastern Canada and hopefully not the last.

The tournament will be held at the Moncton Golf and Country Club, 212 Coverdale Road, in Riverview, New Brunswick. It will be a two day tournament held on Saturday and Sunday, April 26 and 27. On Saturday there will be two separate pair games beginning at 1:00 pm and 7:30 pm. You can play in either or both games. On Sunday, beginning at 10 am there will be a two session Swiss team event. You will need four players to compete in this event. It's lots of fun and if you don't have a partner(s) for the games, contact Connie and partners will be arranged.

This tournament will be an excellent opportunity for new players to compete for prizes and master points in an excellent venue without the pressure of playing against the pros. The emphasis will be on friendly competition, great hospitality and providing an opportunity to meet players of comparable ability who share your love of the game.

You don't have to be a member of the American Contract Bridge League or a member of any bridge club to compete. You just have to be a newcomer. This is a fabulous opportunity to experience tournament play in a relaxed environment. Mark these dates on your calendar. You'll be glad you did. ☺☺☺☺☺☺☺

## **NON-MEMBER SURCHARGES RAISED EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1**

Currently, players who are not members of the American Contract Bridge League or members whose dues are not up to date are assessed a surcharge of \$1 per session for Sectional Tournaments and \$2 per session for Regional Tournaments.

Effective, January 1, 2014, this surcharge will be \$3 per session at sectionals and \$4 per session at Regional tournaments. These surcharges will not apply to the Intermediate-Novice Sectional in Riverview, NB in April.

This is a serious increase. Tournament Directors have been mandated to be diligent in the collection of these fees. I highly recommend that, if you enjoy tournament play, you become a member of the ACBL and that you keep your membership up to date.

## **UNIT 194 TO USE PRE-DUPED HANDS**

Sectional Tournaments in Canadian Maritime Unit 194 will be using pre-dealt hands for all pair games beginning at the Joe Currie Memorial Sectional in Halifax, February 7-9. The Unit has purchased a dealing machine as well as 15 sets of boards.

This should eliminate boards fouled in duplication and help get the game under way in a more timely manner. However, I must point out to our players, that slow starts at our tournaments are due to a variety of factors, not just the duplication of boards. One factor is players showing up at game time or a few minutes later. Another factor is players who are not in their seats at game time because they are working on their convention cards and of course those with a duplication allergy.

If you are unavoidably delayed, please let us know you are coming and then show up! Most of our problems can be solved by players not waiting until the last minute to leave home. Help us out here folks. We really are trying our best to get started on time and preduplicated boards should be a big help. But we do need your cooperation.☺☺☺☺

**This announcement does not affect Unit 230 players as master points won in the STAC continue to count toward the Springhill and Callaghan trophies.**

## A Winner at Bridge

“In the winter of ’65, we were hungry, just barely alive.” So goes a line from the first verse of “The Night They Drove Old Dixie Down”, a 1970 era song about the end of the U.S. Civil War, written by Robbie Robertson. It was first performed by Robertson’s group The Band, and became Joan Baez’s biggest hit when she covered it. I know a little bit about music, and I suspect you’ll enjoy the Baez version more, if you Google it.

*[Editor: I have seen Jon “play” the mountain dulcimer and heard him “sing”. He does, indeed, know a “little bit” about music. As I told him at the time, “Don’t give up your day job.” and that’s knowing that he lists his Occupation as “Retired.”]*

In any event, it was actually the summer of ’61 (1961, not 1865). I was in the back seat of the car, taking a seven minute trip across Concord, NH to play in my first game of duplicate bridge. In those days it was unheard of for an 11 year old to play duplicate, so it had been decided that my mother would be my partner for the night. This was meant to soften the shock to the opponents. *[Editor: Jon is no longer 11 years old, but his presence at the bridge table is still a shock to the other players.]*

While we were on this seven minute drive, my older brother Tom, an ancient 21 years of age, mentioned the word “psych”. “What’s a psych?” I asked. “That’s when you bid something you don’t have.” they said. “Oh.” I said. *[Editor: Uh-oh]*

Yep. It was the middle of the game when I picked up a 6 count with two small Hearts, and found myself Dealing and opening One Heart. Following strength showing bids on my right and a Heart stopper shown on my left, my RHO plowed into 3NT. I declined to lead a Heart, and Dummy (LHO) came down with AQ10x of Hearts.

As soon as Declarer could, he led a Heart from his **five small** and finessed the 10, losing to my mother’s J. Next time in, he hooked another Heart to my mother’s bare K.

At this point Declarer put his cards face down on the table, folded his arms over his stomach, and shook with silent laughter for a full minute. I didn’t know it at the time, of course, but Declarer was a legend-in-the-making in New Hampshire—the great Maurice Emond. Mo and his partner had already placed very high in the annual NH Pairs State Championship. He and various partners would finish second in that prestigious event a record 12 times, and win it on occasion, over the next 50 years.

As fine a player as Mo was, he was known more for his gentlemanly presence and sportsmanship. He was always friendly and respectful to partners and opponents alike. He epitomized the Success at Bridge formula: **1. Be polite. 2. Have fun. 3. Be actively ethical.**

I always enjoyed playing against Mo and chatting with him during my visits to NH. I was sad to see his obituary online in 2012. However, it was great to read so much about his life, including his time in the US Navy, and other occupations. His surviving wife, four children, and many grand and great grandchildren were mentioned, as well as members of his family who had predeceased him. As an example of the role bridge played in Mo’s life came this sentence: “He also was predeceased by his bridge partners, Les Lajoie, Alfred Beaudoin and Oscar Boisvert.” !!!

When it comes to Success at Bridge, Ladies and Gentlemen, we have a Winner! 😊
