A HISTORY OF THE MARITIME BRIDGE LINE

At a recent executive meeting of Unit 194 I was asked if I could do an article on the Master Point trophies. I started by looking through old Maritime Bridge Lines. There was a dearth of information on the origin of the trophies and almost no information on Acadian Unit 230 of any kind, which puzzled me, until I realized that Unit 194 was footing the bill for the first few years. The history of the trophies and, indeed, the history of duplicate bridge in the Maritimes has been disappearing with every In Memoriam. What little human memories that remain are becoming vague. For accuracy we must rely on the minutes of Unit meetings for the early years of our history and on the Maritime Bridge Line for the last 42 years. In this issue I'll give you a brief history of our communication organ as well as some of the highlights of the past 42 years.

- 1972 The Maritime Bridge Line was initiated by Canadian Maritime Unit 194 to keep their members informed of bridge news. Volume 1 number 1 was printed in Spring 1972. It was printed on glossy paper by Halcraft printers in Halifax and mailed individually to every member of Unit 194. Pages were 6" X 9" magazine style. The first editor was Glyn Hatfield. Glyn was an excellent player who, partnered with George Caldwell, were definitely one of the top Maritime pairs (and there were many then).
- **Richard Brown** became the editor and Glyn joined the staff which included his wife, **Ruth**, **Sharron Lewis**, and **Myrna King**. Entry fees were \$3.00.
- **1974 Sharron Lewis** became Associate Editor. During the early years the MBL was printed five or six times a year.
- August, **Norma Symonds** was appointed editor. Her first issue was printed in 1983. Her literary advisor was **Julie Beasy** and technical director **Connie Carter**.
- 1983 Acadian Unit President, Mike Betts, agreed to share the cost of the Maritime Bridge Line and George Colter became Co-editor.
- 1986 The Josey Trophy is renamed the McLeod Trophy.
- **1987 Gylfi Baldursson** became editor.
- 1988 Gary Brown became editor. By now the cost of mailing had quadrupled and the cost of printing was rising to the point where in 1988 the Bridge Line was costing almost \$3000 dollars a year so the units were considering alternatives to the glossy, professionally printed format.

A History of The Maritime Bridge Line (continued)

1991 Gary decided to go to the other side of the world to make his fortune and armed with the fearlessness of youth, an incomparable, genial personality, good looks, and terrific bridge skills, he did just that.

Karl Hicks offered to try to produce a Bridge Line using ordinary paper on a trial basis. The result was far from the professional looking previous issues but there were no complaints. I understood why when I printed 600 copies, mailed a box of 250 copies to Unit 230, tri-folded the other 350 copies, addressed them, stamped them and dropped them at the Post Office. They've come a long way since then thanks to improved technology and programming.

- **1996 Joe Currie** becomes the first Maritime player to win 5000 points.(and I bet none of them were won on the Internet).
- 2000 Playing fees rise to \$8.00.
 - Jon Shute becomes a regular contributor to the Maritime Bridge Line.
- **2006 Joe Currie** becomes an Emerald Life Master with 7500 master points.
- **2007** Bridge fees rise to \$10.00 per session.
- **2008 Mike Hartop** is the first Unit 230 player to be a Diamond Life Master (5000).
- **2010 Victor Lamoureux** becomes Canada's youngest Life Master.
- **2011** Maritime Bridge starts using electronic scoring with Bridgemates.
- **2013** Leo Weniger becomes the first Maritimer on the ACBL Board of Directors.

Gerry Laflamme becomes Unit 230's first Emerald Life Master (7500).

This was also the year that the Maritime Bridge Line went on the web.

There are no longer hard copies of the Maritime Bridge Line except for the copy I print to add to the collection.

I would appreciate hearing from anyone who can give me information on the Master point Trophies (The dates they began and how they originated).

This is by far an incomplete history of Maritime Bridge. Each of the provinces would have their own time-line for the beginning of duplicate bridge and the spawning of clubs in their towns and cities. ©©©©


SLAMMING AGAINST THE PROS

In the recent Can-At we drew the top team of pros led by Curtis Cheek in the first round of a team game. In first seat vulnerable I picked up this hand:

After some consideration I opened one diamond. (two suited hands are somewhat unusual and I found a table once that said the odds were one in 3.13008E-005, a BIG number). My opener was overcalled by two clubs followed by three notrump by partner and pass by right hand opponent. I took some time to respond (as we had not discussed how to bid hands as shapely as these) and eventually with no science available I jumped to six diamonds which was followed by three passes.

The opening lead was a club and this was the hand:



After the opening lead I quickly announced "drawing trumps" and claimed all the tricks if hearts were not 4-0. Curtis Cheek quipped "caught red-handed" as he conceded.

Feeling pretty confident that +1390 was going to be a good result or at worst a tie we completed the round and proceeded to compare.

When I read out "plus 1390", I was somewhat astounded to hear "lose 9"! The bidding at the other table had gone:

5D Double Redouble All Pass

Making 7 for 1800.


Would you call this result unjustified, unexpected, unlucky or all three? By the way, there is an excellent sacrifice against 7 diamonds.

The match did not hinge on this result. (I'll let you guess who won). ⊚⊚⊚⊚

Thank you Boyd for a very enjoyable and pleasant five sessions. The event had each pair play at least 5 boards against each of the other contestants over two and a half days. The result was gold medals for Team Nova Scotia.

Swiss Team Match

Playing in Halifax in the Sectional Swiss, you have a 7 board match vs the leading team. The best player in the room is sitting in your seat--unfortunately, at the other table.

Board 1: You make an undisciplined (even for you) preempt of 2., all Pass and with very good play you make it for 110. We probably could have made a sensible 3. for a push. You resolve to calm down. Partner doesn't say anything about your bid and satisfies the first rule of Success at Bridge: 1. **Be polite.** Board 2: Partner plays 1NT making 120, another likely push.

Board 3: You hold ♠- Kxxx ♥- AKxx ♠-AQxx ♣- x No One Vul. RHO Deals and opens 1♣. You Double, happily (but you don't show any happiness, thereby satisfying rule 3 of Success at Bridge: **3. Be actively ethical.**). LHO bids 1♠, Partner chimes in with 1♠, and RHO bids 2♣. Your bid now: ____

Board 5: You pick up ♠- Axx ♥- AJx ♦- KJ ♣- QJ109x in 4th seat, All Vul. Before you can open 1NT, RHO opens 1NT (15-17). Your bid: _____

Board 6: You and Partner get to 3♥ making 4 on a lucky lie of the cards.

Board 7: Your LHO steam rolls into 6♦. Partner leads the ♠Ace. Dummy, on your Right, lays down 4 trumps (no high honor) and a singleton Spade. After winning the ♠ Ace, Partner shifts to a side suit, putting Dummy on lead. Dummy leads a small Diamond. You hold the 5 4 Doubleton. Your play: ____.

Results:

Board 1 **Push**. Board 2 **Push**.

Board 3 You jumped to $4 \spadesuit$ and Partner made +450. The star player in your seat <u>at the other table</u> bid $3 \spadesuit$ (perhaps devaluing the \spadesuit Q?), all float. Win 6 IMPs.

Board 4 You leaped to 4♥, and when the defense couldn't find the right suit early in the hand you were +420. At the other table they didn't push to game. +7 IMPs.

Board 5 You liked your chances with a Club lead against 1NT so you Passed 1NT (All Pass). Dummy hit with 6 Diamonds to the A and Declarer had Qxx so 5 Diamond tricks allowed them to go +90. At the other table the opponent with your cards also Passed 1NT. Your teammate (Responder to 1NT) transferred to 3♦, but the 1NT bidder then made an undisciplined try at 3NT, doubled, down 1 for -200 and a **loss of 7** IMPs.

Board 6 You **pick up 2** IMPs in your partial as your teammates were -100.

Board 7 You smoothly put in the **5** of Diamonds, masking the 4. Declarer went into the tank and lost a finesse to Partner's **singleton** ◆ King. **Win 11** as your teammates were settled into game.

Win by 19, relegating them to 2nd place and you to 4th, despite your 3-4 record (!), thus satisfying rule 2 from Success at Bridge: 2. Have fun. There! You got all three rules in, in one match!



There have been a few instances of poor behavior at some of the Maritime tournaments lately. I hope this is not a trend. I would remind all players (including myself!) that keeping our tournaments among the most pleasant in existence requires due diligence on all our parts. Our Director, Karl, stands ready to deal with poor behavior, but <u>he must be told about it in a timely fashion</u> before he can do anything.

It is a near certainty that anyone acting poorly at your table is a chronic offender. Maybe the specific behavior that you witnessed doesn't seem "that bad", but someone has to draw the line somewhere, or else the perpetrator will simply go on to the next table and do the same thing.

Simply say, "Director. Please", and when the Director arrives, say, "This gentleman's (or lady's) behavior is detracting from my enjoyment of the game."

The Director will ask for the specific details. **Trust the Director to act appropriately**--<u>if it is a marginal offense</u>, the Director will likely issue a firm notice that this is not acceptable behavior. The Director will make note of the transgression and be prepared to levy a penalty should there be a recurrence. Severe offenses will likely receive an immediate penalty.

In this way, we can continue to have wonderful tournaments. It is the responsibility of **all** of us.

DISTRICT DIRECTOR'S REPORT - Summer 2014

Bridge Played in Vegas, Doesn't Stay in Vegas

The Summer NABC was held at the Westgate Hotel in Las Vegas. While there were some temperature and organization problems and there weren't many restaurants in walking distance, the tournament was well run, with excellent hospitality and entertainment. Attendance was just under 16,616 tables, which was under the estimate of 18,000 and last time's total of 19,000. Numbers should increase in the beautiful Cosmopolitan Hotel which will be the site for the next 2 Las Vegas NABCs and which is on The Strip. I visited it and it is terrific!

A can't miss event at future NABCs is the opening party on Friday night. Nice food and Elvis made a visit.

At the end of this report, I have included a bridge article by Michael Yuen, an excellent player, and good friend, who writes a bridge blog. Thank you, Mike. I am looking for other contributors. All I ask is that it be at most 1 page long and that it be done in Word. Next one would be needed for my report after the Providence NABC which is in Nov/Dec.

I am also listing major results by District 1 players at the NABC. The list is at the end of this report.

Highlights of the Dallas Board of Directors Meeting

Membership was slightly up for the first 6 month of the year, and stands at 167,895.

Regional attendance was up 1%, but average table count was down 9%.

Sectional attendance was down 6% and average table count was down 7%.

STACs table count was up 6% and average table count was also up 1%.

Finance: To date, the decrease in Net Assets from Operations is \$168,076, \$12,000 better than budget.

IT: Website home page has been redesigned, and launched.

Table count: Through June, face to face table count is down 3.68%. Overall table count is 1,546,944 of which 470,327 are from on-line games. Total tables are down 2.13% compared to 1st half of 2013, but May and June tables from one on-line club are not included.

Master point Confirmation postcards: were discontinued as of June 1.

ACBL Score+: has been discontinued. It was decided to enhance the features and benefits of Score and extend its life and functionality. Total cost to ACBL is over \$1.5 Million, and Administration is trying to determine what parts of Score+ can be repurposed into enhanced Score. This is a major loss for ACBL.

Longest Day: 176 clubs participating and raising \$531,300 was raised as of Aug 1.

Strategic Planning:

On line learn to play bridge is still being tested.

On line partnership desk for NABCs and Regionals is being developed and it will be usable by members the day of events with text sent to cell phones.

The Deferred Benefit Pension Plan: has been terminated as planned.

Tournament Director Structure Review: is continuing under leadership of Sylvia Hardin, HR Director. A new TD training program has been developed and it will be tested this year.

ACBL Resource Centre: will soon be a new place to get printed materials for Education, clubs, Units and Districts.

Motions approved:

- The proposed play schedule (for NABC events) for the three annual NABCs will be implemented in 2015 on a trial basis, subject to Board approval of any new events.
- During NABC stages of GNT, screens will be used in Flight B at same point as the higher flights.
- After a 2nd vote in Providence there will probably be a number of changes to Master Point structure. The effects will be to increase some overall NABC+ event awards, Regional Pairs will pay more overall and to more places. 3 Session KOs will pay more, classification of some special games will change, some going up and some down (eg STACs will pay less and Sectionals will pay more).
- Fall NABC NA Swiss will go to 3 days from 2 days, to start on the 2nd Friday.
- International Fund Game #1 will be played on Super Bowl Saturday.
- NABC+ Mixed Swiss will be on the 2nd Saturday and Sunday of the Fall NABC.
- January will be Junior Fund Month, April will be Charity Fund Month, May will be Grass Root Fund Month and September will be International Fund Month.
- Each District will be allowed 4 pairs in Flights B and C of the NAP.

District News

ACBL President Phyllis Harlan has visited the CanAt and will be visiting the Can-Am and Quebec City. Thanks to all who help make her stay a pleasant one. ACBL CEO was also at the CanAt for a few days.

District Meeting: Delegates are invited to the District 1 Annual Meeting which will be held after the afternoon session at the CanAm in Montreal on Saturday, August 16th.

Play Nice: This program to promote Zero Tolerance has been well received by clubs. Additional posters are available for clubs from ACBL. Thanks to the Montreal Unit for getting it translated into French. ACBL Headquarters has printed the French posters. All Francophone clubs in the District should have received them recently.

Tournaments: Please come to the National Capital Regional in Ottawa in Oct. 2014. In 2015, Montreal will host the Canadian Bridge Championships in May and the Can-Am in August, and there will be a Regional in Quebec City in May and the CanAt in Fredericton in June/July. Then, Kingston will be the site of the CBF Regional in July/August.

Upcoming NABCs: Providence (close to District 1) in the fall, and in 2015, New Orleans (March) and Chicago (August).


Simply Brilliant!

In Atlanta GA USA. The Spingold final Team Bridge24 (Jacek Kalita, Michal Nowosadzki, Rafal Jagniewski, Wojciech Gawel) tied Team Grue (Joe Grue, Leslie Amoils, Brad Moss, Thomas Bessis, Peter Bertheau and Jacob Morgan) 112 IMPs at the end of regulation (64 Boards).

The 8 board playoff decided the event in favor of Bridge24. 134 to 113 IMPs.


This deal declared by Kalita contributed to his teams' victory.



The lead was the nine of clubs, queen, two, three. First he looked for tricks from the heart suit with the ten of hearts from dummy, covered by the king, ace and two. He believed that the king was a true card. He next went after the spade suit with the four of spades, nine, jack and three.

He gave the nine of spades a look. Backing his judgment of the singleton nine, took the spades finesse to the eight when Grue followed with the five. Next he ran three spades winners, Moss discarded all low diamonds.

At trick 8, cashed the ace of clubs, Moss discarded another diamond.



This was the five-card ending at trick 9.

Reading the position perfectly, Kalita exited with the four of hearts to end-play Moss into giving up the game going trick with either a diamond or a heart.

Made nine tricks for +400.

At the other table. South opened with one diamond, and soon was in three diamonds. Made 9 tricks for +110.

+400 and +110 was worth 11 IMPs to Team Bridge24.

Congratulations to both teams for a well played match.
