# Pre-Dupes in A/X Swiss Experiment A Success

## Halifax Fall Swiss Experiment Successful

For some time, Dan Landry, immediate Past-President of Canadian Maritime Unit 194 has championed the idea of duplicated hands for the top matches in the AX Swiss Teams in the later rounds.

With seven rounds, when we get down to the last couple of rounds, most of the top teams have already played each other (certainly going into the last round). As a result, many of the top teams are playing the final round against a team that is not in contention. Since we are playing shuffled boards, some teams end up playing 'part scores' leading to close matches while other teams are playing 'game and slam hands' which favor the better teams. The only way to level the playing field is to play the same hands.

This is done at National Tournaments and some large Regionals in the later rounds of major events.

As this was the last tournament in Dan's term as President, the directing staff decided to surprise Dan and the players with pre-duplicated hands in the AX Swiss event on Sunday.

How could we manage this? We had only 15 sets of boards of which 14 were already pre-duped for the pairs games. I was dead against sharing boards between matches since a slow player or pair would hold up more than one match. To pull a board(s) in a match could result in teams who were playing on the clock losing a board.

The only way to avoid this was to have a set of boards for each match. One set of boards would enable us to have duplicated boards for the last five rounds. Since a three-way uses three sets of boards and usually contains three of the lowest scoring teams they would shuffle and play. Since we only had one set of boards available, Edgar Blinn (who has offered to provide pre-dupes for the pairs events) kindly offered to use the boards from Friday's pair games and Saturday morning's Pairs to provide nine more sets for Swiss on Sunday. Thank you for the effort Ed, as it had to be done between and after the

Sessions on Friday and Saturday which was no small feat. Not to mention the efforts of our caddies who would have to pick-up the boards after each round and put new boards out for the next round while we were taking in results.

Other logistical problems existed. Normally we turn the tables 45 degrees for the Swiss teams. This provides a good deal of extra space between tables so it's easier for caddies, players and directors to get around. For those of you who are wondering why we don't do this in pair games, angled tables enable players to see upcoming hands at other tables as the boards are duplicated while in Swiss games, every match is shuffled so the hands are different. Now some of the hands would be duplicated so we would have to have the tables in those matches lined up as in the pair game.

We were more than a little nervous at game time when we announced our plan. Guess how many teams we had in the AX event! We won the lottery. Twenty-three teams. That was ten head-on matches and a three-way. We had ten sets of boards and the three-way was a shuffle and play. All matches would play duplicated hands for the last five rounds. What were the odds. Time to buy a lottery ticket. Rounds one and two were shuffle and play. Round three, each match played boards 1-7, round four boards 8-14, etc until round seven when each team played boards 29-35 using all our sets.

The operation was a success and the patient survived. Who could ask for more. Based on our success, Unit 194 has purchased additional boards and cards which will enable us to have duplicated boards in the top matches of the AX Swiss. We are expecting to have the top six or seven matches pre-duplicated for our future Swiss Team events.

A tip of the hat to Past-President Dan Landry for his promotion of this idea, to Edgar Blinn for his duplicating efforts under duress and to our players whose cooperation made this innovation work flawlessly. ③⑤⑤⑤⑤

DO call the Director whenever there is an infraction at your table.

DO NOT wear Perfumes, Aftershave Lotion, or Other scents.

DO NOT discuss a hand or result until you have completed playing all the hands in a round.

DO NOT put boards on the floor when passing them in Pairs Event.

DO NOT put boards on the floor during Swiss matches.

DO NOT put team entries in your pocket or purse.

DO NOT pass in a losing Swiss Team ticket

DO NOT record the contract before making the opening lead.

This is not a tempest in a teapot. Some players have stopped playing for this reason alone. It is a problem that can't be ignored. Please consider your fellow bridge enthusiasts and not use artificial scents when attending our tournaments.

Also please do not take it personally if the director approaches you concerning this problem. ⊗⊗⊗⊗
