STOP Using the Stop Card

The ACBL Board of Directors passed a motion at the Toronto Nationals in July eliminating the use of the STOP card effective January 1, 2018.

This is the red card in your bidding box which has been around a long time and whose purpose is still not fully understood by many of our players old and new. The STOP Card was designed to warn the player next to bid that the current bidder was about to skip a level(s) of bidding and required the next player to wait ten seconds before making their call. (This morphed into having the next player wait to bid until the STOP card player removed the STOP card from the table.)

The idea was to eliminate situations where the next player would quickly pass indicating a poor hand or would pause for thought before passing which would indicate to partner that he had some values.

The reason(s) for getting rid of the STOP card were never made clear to me. I am assuming that a Skip Bid warning would still be made when skipping a level(s) of bidding and that players should still pause for a reasonable length of time after the skip bid before making the next call.

DISTRICT 1 FIELDS TEAMS IN ALL DIVISIONS

This year, ACBL District 1 (Eastern Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick. Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, and Newfoundland-Labrador) was represented in the 2017 Grand National Team Championships in Toronto in all four divisions.

Maritime teams represented Flights A and C while Ontario and Quebec fielded teams in the Superflight and Flight B. All four teams qualified in the two session swiss team event which reduced the 25 team fields to 16 teams for the knockout portion of the five day event. All four teams lost their first 56 board knockout match.

Speaking for the A team, we each felt that our opponents (while playing well could have been beaten) but they went on to win the event. Good on them!

21 Rules for Being a Good Partner

"I have always believed that your attitude toward your partner is as important as your technical skill at the game." Rixi Markus, one of the alltime great players.

Before you sit down to discuss what you are playing, you should start your partnership off on the right note. Half the battle of winning is being a good partner. Always observe the following:

1. Do not give lessons, unless you are being paid to do so. "According to an evening paper, there are only five real authorities on bridge in this country. Odd how often one gets one of them as a partner." Punch (British magazine).

2. Never say anything to your partner unless you would want him to say the same to you. If you are unsure whether your partner would want you to say something, Don't.

3. Never "result" (criticize your partner for a normal action just because it did not work this time).

4. Unless your intent is to clear up a misunderstanding, avoid discussing the hand just played. If you cannot resist, be discreet.

5. Remember - you and your partner are on the same side.

6. Do not forget that your partner wants to win as much as you do.

7. If you feel the urge to be nasty, sarcastic, critical or loud, excuse yourself and take a walk.

8. When there is time between hands, do not discuss bridge.

9. When you want to consult another player about a disaster, ask about your hand, not your partner's.

10. Do not ever criticize or embarrass your partner in front of others.

11. Remember that bridge is only a card game.

12. Have a good time, and make sure that your partner does also. "Bridge is for fun. You should play the game for no other reason. You should not play bridge to make money, to show how smart you are, or show how stupid your partner is... or to prove any of the several hundred other things bridge players are so often trying to prove." -Bridge legend Charles Goren.

13. Trust your partner; do not assume he has made a mistake.

14. Although it may be unfashionable, it really is okay to be pleasant to a partner with whom you also happen to live.

15. Remember: *"The worst analysts and the biggest talkers are often one and the same."* -Bridge columnist Frank Stewart. Think twice before verbally analyzing a hand. Do not embarrass yourself with a hasty, inaccurate comment.

16. When you voluntarily choose to play bridge with someone, it is not fair to get upset when partner does not play any better than usual.

17. Never side with an opponent against your partner. If you cannot support your partner, say nothing.

18. If you think you are too good for a partner, and do not enjoy playing bridge with him, do everyone a favor and play with someone else. That is clearly much better than being a martyr. However, be careful before burning bridges -- another player's grass may not be greener.

19. Learn your partner's style, regardless of how you feel about it. Do not expect your partner to bid exactly as you would. When partner makes a bid, consider what he will have, not what you would have.

20. Try to picture problems from partner's point of view. Seek the bid or play that will make his life easiest.

21. Sympathize with partner if he makes a mistake. Let your partner know that you like him, and always root for him 100%.

DISTRICT DIRECTOR'S REPORT - Summer 2017 "Toronto the Good" Tournament

The Summer NABC was held in a beautiful convention centre in great playing conditions (lots of space and great lighting). The host hotels were 1st class and the area had lots of nearby restaurants and other attractions, and public transportation was excellent. The tournament was well run, with excellent hospitality (with especially generous food). Attendance was higher than estimated. Table count was 13,289 tables, higher than the 12,500 budgeted.

The Board meetings ran from Tues-Sat, (with some days running as late as 7 pm). We continued to work on improving our efficiency and looking for Board priorities and improvements for the future. Our Task Force on Clubs, and the one on Tournaments continued their work and will report in San Diego. We are also concentrating on volunteers and membership recruitment and retention. The big item was the presence of new CEO Bahar Gidwani, who has already begun to work on how to improve ACBL in the future. For continuity, we also had outgoing CEO Robert Hartman. I'm sure you'll join me in thanking him for his efforts, and wish him well in the future.

At the end of this report, I am listing the top 100 Master point winners of District 1 players at the NABC.

For the 1st time during my times as District 1 Director, I do not have a bridge article. I am still looking for bridge article contributors, to restart my tradition of an article in each Report. All I ask is that it be approximately one page long and that it be done in Word. Next one would be needed for my report after the San Diego NABC which will be in Nov/Dec.

Highlights of the Toronto Board of Directors Meetings

Bahar Gidwani has been CEO since July 1. We are impressed with how fast he is coming up to speed. I wish him the best, and look forward to working with him and the Board in the future. **Robert Hartman** has finished his time with ACBL effective July 31st.

Gary Blevins was appointed Director of Operations.

- **Membership** is up 95 from the Dec 2016 total. There were 6,000 new members in the 1^{st} half of 2017.
- **Revenue** was up 2% from the fees increase. 30% of renewals were at the new 3-year rate.
- Kansas City: table count was 13% lower than the 9,000 forecasted.
- Total tournament tables decreased 4%.
- **Club Table count**: Table count for the year to date is down 3%. On-Line table count is up 6%
- **Information Technology:** Significant progress was made on replacing ACBLscore with a 3rd party scoring engine. Alpha testing was completed and it is hoped to be finished by next spring. ACBL Live, Tourneytrax, FinancialTrax and NABC seeding have been improved.
- **Finance**: Expenses were \$299K below budget and Revenue was down \$102K. Membership Revenue was up due to increase in fees, but down vs budget. There is a good chance that ACBL expenses will be able to be paid in \$ Can. More details will follow, when they are known.
- **The Longest Day**: This was held on Wednesday, June 21st and raised \$700K. Day of Bridge-Benefiting Alzheimer Societies of Canada, was successfully held in our District. For example, The Bridge Studio, Halifax had over 130 tables of 12 board games that day, and a good time was had by all!

Actions and Motions approved at the Toronto Board of Directors Meetings:

- Fall 2022 NABC will be in Phoenix instead of Orlando. Summer 2023 NABC will be in Chicago.
- The Workplace Harassment policy will now include Unit and District volunteers.
- The Code of Disciplinary Regulations has been revised and replaced.
- A line of credit of \$2 million was approved at no cost to ACBL.
- Motion to have teams at NABCs pay on a per team basis, instead of as happens now, on a per player basis was again defeated.
- A motion to eliminate the use of the "Stop" card was approved effective Jan. 1/18.
- If an NABC table count is projected to be greater than 10K, the money allocated to the NABC for hospitality will be the number of tables times \$11.50 per table If the count is greater than the estimate an additional \$11.50 per extra table will be allocated.
- Remedies for cases where a kibitzer brings infractions (eg revokes) to the attention of players at the table are being looked into. This used to be in The Laws of Duplicate Bridge, but was removed in the last 2 revisions. I brought this to the Board's Bridge Committee.
- Club games for player with less than 20 MPs are allowed to use prepared lesson hands. Games must be 6 or 12 boards with at least 8 players, and a small amount of MPs will be awarded.
- New convention charts (to replace the current General Chart, Mid Chart etc,) are being worked on and will be reviewed in San Diego.

- A motion to have the USBF, CBF and Mexican Bridge Federations pay any membership dues to the WBF was approved, with implementation on a sliding scale over a number of years. ACBL will help these NBOs raise additional funds.
- \cdot When written defences to conventions are required or permitted they may be referred to by either pair.
- 2 daylight on-line robot games may be held daily (1 IMPs and 1 MPs). Up to 15 hours are allowed for play and they must be either 12 or 18 boards. There will be overall awards for 10+ participants (2.5 MPs for 1st in a 18 boards and 1.5 for 1st place in a 12 board game).

District News

- **The late Peter Nagy**, who started his bridge career in Montreal, was inducted into to the ACBL Hall of Fame. A well deserved award.
- **Cukoff-Latraverse-Wiser (CLW) Award**: Named after outstanding deceased National Tournament Directors from District 1, this award recognizes excellent life time service to directors and promoters of ethics in bridge. Nominees from the Units are still encouraged. The District Board will announce this year's winner at the District Board Meeting in August.
- George Retek Award: Presented to an individual who has given a great deal of excellent volunteer service to our District and Units. This award winner will be announced at the District Meeting in August.
- Sandra MacPherson, Peter Clark and Ronald Carriere were elected to the Board of Governors for a 3-year term starting Jan 1, 2018.
- **Regional Tournaments**: Please come to our District's tournaments Ottawa in October, Kingston and Chicoutimi in May, CanAt in Halifax in June/July, and Can-Am in Montreal in Aug. Congratulations to the organizers of the successful and enjoyable CanAt in Moncton (the 1st time in 30+ years).
- **Upcoming NABCs**: San Diego (Nov/Dec 2017), Philadelphia (March 2018), Atlanta (July 2018) Montreal (Summer 2020).
- **The Canadian Bridge Championships** will be help in downtown Montreal May/June 2018. Thanks to the Montreal Unit for "stepping up to the plate".
- **NAP District Finals**: will be held in Oct/Nov. Please look at your unit's publication or the District website to find about dates and locations of the finals for all flights. <u>http://district1acbl.org/races-tournaments/nap/</u>.

The National Finals for all flights will be held at the Spring NABC in Philadelphia.

- **GNT National Finals**: The National Finals were held at the Toronto NABC, and. For the 1st time District 1 representative in all 4 flights made it to the final 16. Well done by all!
- **District Meetings:** The District 1 Annual Meeting will be held at the Can-Am on Saturday of the Can-Am Regional in Laval, QC. There are also 3-4 District Board conference calls held during the year.
